

Coursework & Assignment Descriptions

Tests. There will be four non-cumulative exams during the semester. They will cover material only from the previous test, although many concepts build upon each other. These can be comprised of multiple choice, fill-in-the-blank, short answer, and essay questions. The lowest score is dropped. No late tests or make-ups are accepted.

PEP Points. PEP stands for Participation, Effort, and Preparation. PEP is collected in a variety of ways such as reading quizzes, individual and group activities, or small homework assignments. You'll get up to 2 "freebie" points to account for missed PEP. No late submissions or make ups are accepted.

Reading Assignments. You will submit handwritten Reading Assignments every week based on the reading for that class. They are each worth 3 points. The lowest two scores will get dropped. No late submissions or make ups are accepted.

Signature Assignment/Life Labs Signature Assignments are a way for you to dive deeper into the material we cover in class that you find most interesting. You choose 3 out of 5 of them to complete. It also is a way to take the concepts from the class and apply them directly to your life and society. Guidelines will be posted on Canvas. This will also be put on your ePortfolio. Late submissions lose 1 point for each day late, including weekends and holidays.

Flair Points. There is only one way to earn extra credit. This is done by going above the minimum and participating in approved school and community events that relate to psychology and science. If you have suggestions for events, let me know in advance for consideration. Opportunities will be announced in class and on Canvas. You get 1 point per each event. You may earn up to 2 Flair points (2% of your grade). Do not ask for any other extra credit.
